AITI signs contract to conduct ICT survey

THE Authority for Info-communications Technology Industry of Brunei Darussalam (AITI) recently signed a contract with Rennovo Solutions Sdn Bhd, for the consultancy services to perform a household ICT survey project .

According to a press statement from AITI, the contract was signed on Wednesday between Chief Executive Hj Yahkup Hj Menudin and Chairman of Rennovo Solutions Sdn Bhd Hj Sapawi Bolhassan.

The ceremony was held at the AITI office in Anggerek Desa.

The household ICT survey will be the second conducted by AITI. The first was carried out in 2010.

"The objective of the project is to perform a survey to gather a set of ICT-related data within the households in Brunei Darussalam. This survey shall provide data on the basic indicators of the ICT situation in households, its trends and usage," the statement said.

This survey shall facilitate in assessing and monitoring the extent of which the Bruneian households have access to ICT and its related facilities.

"The first phase of the project will involve the design of questionnaire that are ICT related according to the International Telecommunity Union (ITU) standards. The survey will be carried out in the next phase

for the duration of two weeks by means of self-enumerated questionnaire which will be in both English and Malay. A group of enumerators representing Rennovo Solutions Sdn Bhd will be conducting the survey to households selected randomly," the statement added.

The AITI was set up in 2003 to license and regulate the operation of telecommunications infrastructure and services in Brunei Darussalam. - Rasidah HABThe Brunei Times
